## Curtner Road Booster Station Upgrade Project

### What’s happening?

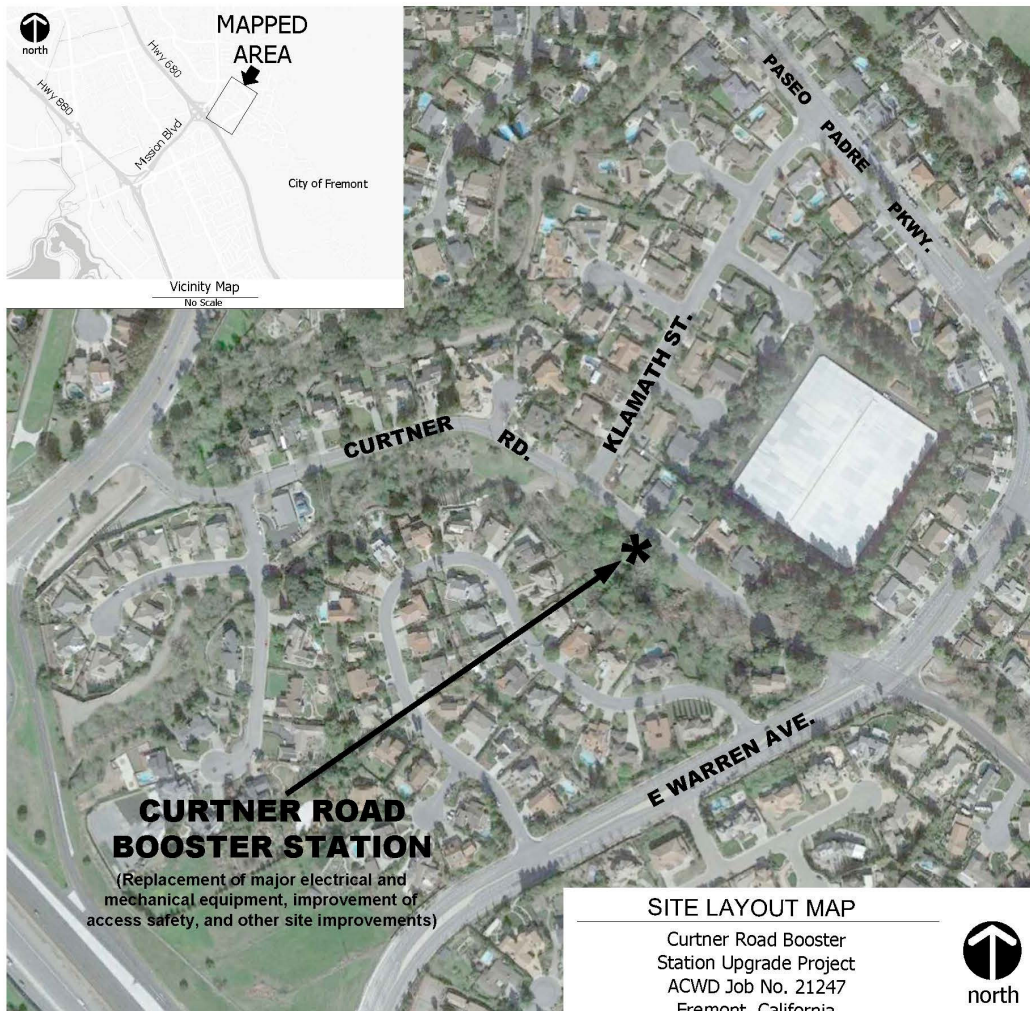
The Alameda County Water District (ACWD) continues to invest in infrastructure to help ensure a reliable supply of high-quality drinking water to our customers. To improve water quality, supply, fire flow and storage reliability in your neighborhood, ACWD will soon begin an upgrade project on the Curtner Road Booster Station. The Curtner Road Booster Station is located near the intersection of Curtner Road and Klamath Street in Fremont (see map below). The Project will involve the replacement of essential mechanical and electrical equipment including pumps and piping, as well as miscellaneous site and safety improvements. Precautionary measures will be taken at the Curtner Road Booster Station to ensure the continued delivery of reliable high-quality water to area customers during construction.

### When will construction begin?

Construction is scheduled to start in June 2022 and will be performed by the Alameda County Water District’s contractor for this project, Disney Construction.

### How long will the construction take?

The project, in its entirety, is expected to be completed in 12 months (June 2022 – June 2023).



## How will I be impacted?

The project, including the provisions for construction, replacement of the essential mechanical and electrical equipment, site safety improvements, and other miscellaneous site improvements will occur on ACWD's property near the public right-of-way. The project is expected to have minimal impact on residents and businesses.

No interruptions to your water service are planned nor expected. If a planned interruption is required, notification will be provided at least 24 hours in advance to those customers who will be impacted.

## What can I expect during construction?

- **Visual**

Minimal construction traffic, including construction vehicles and equipment, are expected throughout the course of the project. In addition, the contractor will have small stockpiles of materials, including but not limited to pipe and soil/aggregates.

- **Construction Noise**

When construction is occurring, residents may hear construction noise and/or experience vibrations.

- **Traffic Control Measures**

At certain times during the project, temporary traffic control measures may be implemented along Curtner Road.

- **Workspace Safety**

Construction activities will be completed in accordance with all federal, state and local safety regulations and guidelines. Nevertheless, construction sites can be dangerous. The site will be barricaded and secured for the safety of the crew and the public. Please maintain a safe distance from all construction equipment and materials.

- **Working Hours**

Work hours are anticipated to be Monday through Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. No work is planned on Saturdays, Sundays or ACWD holidays.
