


What’s happening?

The Alameda County Water District (ACWD) continues to invest in infrastructure to ensure a reliable supply of high-quality drinking water to our customers. That investment includes the Alvarado Niles Pipeline Seismic Improvement Project – Phase II. This project is part of the District’s Water Main Renewal and Seismic Improvement Program and will replace approximately 1.8 miles of 60 to 70-year-old water mains and appurtenances while improving system hydraulics and seismic reliability, and reducing maintenance costs.

The project is located on Smith Street near the Union Pacific Railroad tracks, and on Alvarado-Niles Road between Santa Maria Drive and Almaden Boulevard, and between Central Avenue and Decoto Road, shown in red below.



When will construction begin?

Project work will be performed by ACWD’s Contractor, **Ranger Pipelines, Inc.** Preliminary exploratory work will begin in July 2025 and full construction will commence in December 2025.

How long will the construction take?

The project is anticipated to be completed in approximately 18 months, finishing in spring of 2027.

How will I be impacted?

The project’s site improvements will occur in the street and are expected to temporarily impact residents and businesses along Alvarado-Niles Road during construction. Planned interruptions to water services are expected during pipeline and service line connections. The contractor will provide 24-hour notice to customers when water service needs to be temporarily interrupted.

What can I expect during construction?

- **Traffic**

Increased traffic is anticipated during construction. Delivery vehicles and heavy construction equipment will be operating in the area. Temporary lane closures, detours, and restrictions on street parking spaces along the project route are anticipated. Motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians are encouraged to exercise caution. **Those traveling on Alvarado-Niles Road should consider adjusting their travel schedules to account for increased traffic and other minor delays.**

- **Workspace Safety**

Construction activities will be completed in accordance with all federal, state, and local safety regulations and guidelines. Nevertheless, construction sites can be dangerous. All construction activities will occur on the public right of way streets and will be marked with signs and other safety measures. Please do not enter the construction site for any reason.

- **Construction Noise**

When construction is occurring, residents and businesses may experience noise, vibration, and other construction related impacts.

- **Working Hours**

Working hours are anticipated to be Monday through Friday as indicated below; other restricted working hours, or night work, may occur at certain locations or to perform certain construction work. The contractor will strive to maintain the working hours indicated and reduce the inconvenience associated with very early and very late construction. However, longer construction hours may occasionally be required to minimize water service disruptions and/or to reduce traffic impacts.
